Positive Momentum Confirmed

Wiit delivered a robust set of 9M25 results, confirming the group's ability to combine ARR growth with meaningful operating leverage across geographies. Commercial momentum remained positive, with several contract renewals and new signings across verticals (Professional Services, Marketing Technology, Digital Trust, Manufacturing). The pipeline remains solid in both Italy and Germany, where gross bookings YTD already exceed the FY24 levels by c.30%. Management reiterated its strategic focus on premium Secure Private/Hybrid Cloud services, Al-enabled platforms, and continued M&A scouting in the DACH region. Rating and TP reiterated.

Results at a glance

Revenues reached EUR 125.7M (+9.2% yoy), supported by the continued expansion of recurring cloud and cybersecurity services in Italy and Germany and the contribution from the 2024 acquisitions (Edge&Cloud, Econis, Michgehl & Partner). ARR rose 11.6% yoy to EUR 102.3M, representing 89% of total revenues, with organic growth at +4.9% (+10.3% gross of churn), reflecting the strategic focus on high-value contracts. Adj. EBITDA increased 19.5% yoy to EUR 50.9M, with margin rising 350bps to 40.5%, driven by a mix shift toward highervalue services, process optimisation, and the first wave of cost synergies from the German and Swiss integrations. On a like-for-like basis, the EBITDA margin would have reached 43.2% (+619bps yoy). Italy posted a strong 54% margin, while Germany improved to 37.7%, despite the dilutive effect of newly consolidated entities. Adj. EBIT grew 17.1% yoy to EUR 26.4M despite higher D&A linked to recent data-centre investments.

NFP and new bond

NFP stood at EUR 218.1M (EUR 203.7M ex-IFRS 16), broadly stable vs. YE24 after EUR 25M capex, EUR 7.8M dividends, and EUR 2M buybacks, partly offset by EUR 31M of OCF. Wiit successfully completed the placement of its new unrated, non-convertible, unsecured bond on the MOT, raising EUR 215M. From a strategic perspective, the transaction improved financial flexibility to support organic growth initiatives and selective M&A strategy, while also pre-funding the refinancing of its existing EUR 150M bond (expiring October 2026). The higher coupon relative to the expiring issue (2.375% vs. 4.375% for the new bond) reflects the current interest rate environment. We calculate overall financial charges at around EUR 10-11M from FY26.

Investment case recap

Wiit's business model provides high visibility on organic growth with ~90% of sales derived from multi-year recurring contracts. Moreover, the churn rate is very low (c.2% in Italy, 4% in Germany), reflecting high client retention. Commercial pipeline remains robust. Wiit currently trades at undemanding multiples: 11.2x-8.9x EV/EBITDA and 29.8x-18.9x adj. P/E for 2025-27E, significantly below its 5-year historical EV/EBITDA average of ~15x.



Estimates Fine-Tuning

We fine-tune our estimates primarily to reflect a slightly lower top line, driven by the ongoing clean-up of low-margin revenues, as well as higher financial charges associated with the new bond.

Valuation and Key Risks

Valuation basis

Our EUR 26.2 TP is derived with a multiples' comparison valuation based on the average 2025E-26E EV/EBIT and P/E and a DCF approach, using a 7.58% WACC (RFR at 3.5%; ERP at 6.00%), a 2.0% terminal growth rate, a gearing of 30%.

Key Risks

Company specific risks:

- The niche market in which the group operates could limit the number of target companies to be acquired and therefore result in difficulties in identifying and finding investment opportunities;
- The group's revenues are concentrated on a limited number of customers.
- Cybersecurity risks to proprietary infrastructure

Sector generic risks:

- Increasing competition from major players;
- A potential decrease in the price of services resulting from the growing maturity of the cloud market.

WIIT operates proprietary data centres; its main one is Tier IV certified by Uptime Institute LLC in Seattle (US) and, with particular reference to SAP, the company is among the most certified SAP partners in the world in Outsourcing Operations.
